salve/salvete** hello bonum diem good day bonam vésperum good evening bonam noctem goodnight vale/valete** goodbye

It is polite to add domine (Sir) for a man, domina (Madam) for a woman, and dominula (Miss) for a girl.






salve can mean "Goodbye" as well as "Hello".

bonum diem means "Good


